PY 2013 – 14

	Actual	Goal	Difference
Employment / Education	49.4% (130/263)	50%	-.6%
Degree / Certificate	48.1% (77/160)	40%	+8.1%
Literacy & Numeracy	24.2% (22/91)	35%	-10.8%



Mid-Year WIA Youth Performance PY 2014 – 15

Enrollment 146	Employment / Education 27% Actual 24 Goal 90
Degree / Certificate 17% Actual 10 Goal 58	Literacy & Numeracy 35% Actual 25 Goal 71



Projections

- Outcomes have different time frames
 - Enrollments depend on start dates
 - Literacy / Numeracy gains require weeks of study
- Providers make projections at the beginning of the year



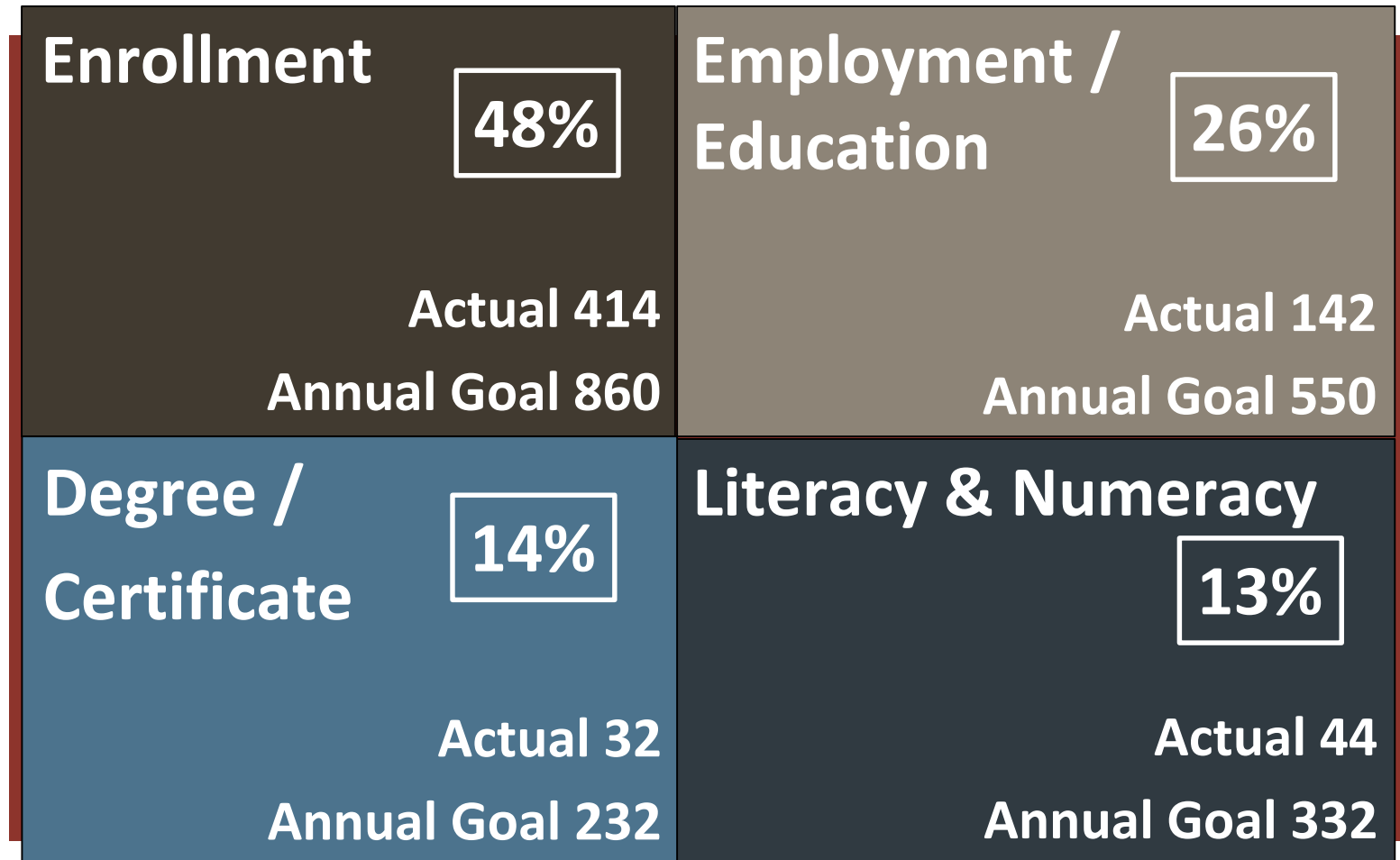

Total Carry-Ins 159 Providers “carry-in” clients when the program year ends, and they’re not done serving them	Employment / Education 28% Actual 27 Goal 98
Degree / Certificate 51% Actual 26 Goal 51	Literacy & Numeracy 24% Actual 24 Goal 102



Corrective Action Notices

- Providers receive Corrective Action Notices if they do not reach 80% of their quarterly projections
- Providers submit plans to improve performance and revise projections if necessary
