#### **Roll Call**

Kevin Carroll, WISF Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:05 A.M. He invited members to introduce themselves and to share the first job they ever held.

### Adoption of Agenda (Action Item)

On motion, seconded and carried, the agenda was unanimously adopted.

# Approval of Minutes from December 10, 2014

On motion, seconded and carried, the minutes of the December 10, 2014 WISF meeting minutes were unanimously approved.

## **Director's Report** (Discussion Item)

Mr. Carroll invited OEWD Director Todd Rufo to deliver the Director's Report.

#### **Director Search Update**

Mr. Rufo announced that he would be conducting meetings in small groups with WISF members to assess the current challenges and opportunities in the workforce system, as well

as to hear about any specific assets and characteristics they would like to see in a new Workforce Development Division Director. He shared that he would also conduct a meeting with the Executive Directors of OEWD's funded agencies.

#### **Shared Prosperity Agenda**

Mr. Rufo announced that, while San Francisco's unemployment rate is at a low 4.1%, there are still approximately 22,000 un/deremployed residents in need of workforce training and placement services. He underscored the Mayor's anti-poverty priorities and OEWD's critical role in addressing challenges for those with the highest barriers to employment.

#### Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA)

Mr. Rufo shared that the new WIOA regulations should be released at the end of March.

#### **Program/Sector Updates**

Mr. Rufo invited John Halpin to report out on recent OEWD programmatic highlights. Mr. Halpin shared participant enrollment and placement numbers for the first half of the program year (July 1, 2014-December 31, 2014). He also shared highlights from the following recent events:

- February 10<sup>th</sup>: Culinary Arts Student Showcase
- President Obama's TechHire Initiative in Washington, D.C. (TechSF spotlighted)

Finally, Mr. Halpin acknowledged the recent retirement of WISF Board Member Darlene Rutkowski from the Department of Rehabilitation, and the upcoming retirement of Linda Palmquist from the Employment Development Department. Mr. Halpin asked the Board to join him in thanking Ms. Palmquist for her partnership and support.

#### **Health Care Subcommittee Report-out**

Mr. Rufo invited WISF Board Member Toni Rucker, Department of Public Health, to report back on the January 29 meeting of the WISF Health Care Subcommittee. Ms. Rucker shared that the meeting focused on reviewing training content and data on emerging opportunities and staffing needs in the health care field throughout the region. Finally, Ms. Rucker shared that three new members joined the subcommittee – Barbara Bock (California Health Workforce Initiative), Brenda Yee (Chinese Hospital) and David Serrano Sewell (Hospitality Council of Northern & Central California).

#### **Youth Council Report-out**

Greg Asay, Principal Workforce Analyst, reported out on the February 25 meeting of the WISF Youth Council. He shared City College of San Francisco (CCSF) applied for California Career Pathways Trust (CCPT) funding in collaboration with the SF Unified School District (SFUSD), the Department of Children, Youth and their Families (DCYF), and OEWD, and that awardees would be announced in May. Additionally, he shared that Youth Council members are interested in a stronger collaboration with the WISF, analyzing labor market information, and creating a service map for youth.

#### **Business Services Update**

Thomas Myers, Deputy Director of Workforce Development, shared a schedule of upcoming job fairs and encouraged WISF members to participate in the Mayor's Jobs+ youth employment initiative. He invited members to sign up to volunteer at the Youth Resource Fair on May 9.

#### **CityBuild Update**

Patrick Mulligan, Director of CityBuild, presented an update on the Mandatory Local Hire Policy for Construction. He shared that the Mayor's Construction Workforce Advisory Committee made a recommendation to the Board of Supervisors to extend the legislative review period for another 24 months and to hold the percentage where it is. Mr. Mulligan also shared that CityBuild – in partnership with the SF Unified School District, Adult Probation, the District Attorney's Office, and other partners – is actively working to increase the construction pipeline with a goal of doubling the number of apprentices over the next five years.

Discussion followed.

Presentation: Citywide Workforce Development Plan (Discussion Item) Kevin Carroll invited Emylene Aspilla, Strategic Initiatives Director, to present on the Citywide Workforce Development Plan, which was developed by the newly created City Workforce Alignment Committee. The Alignment Committee is a working group chaired by the Mayor's Office and comprised of multiple City departments and Board of Supervisors President London Breed. Ms. Aspilla shared a snapshot of the plan, including an inventory of workforce programs throughout the City, a breakdown of client demographics, as well as areas that would require further exploration.

Discussion followed.

### Public Comment (Discussion Item)

Kevin Carroll called for public comment.

Saidah Leatufu, Young Community Developers, commented on the lack of fulltime positions for youth, and encouraged staff and Board members to focus on providing sustainable, fulltime, benefitted employment for youth through the Jobs+ initiative.

### Adjournment (Action Item)

Mr. Carroll called for a motion to adjourn the meeting. On motion, seconded and carried, the meeting was adjourned at 10:50 A.M.
