Understanding and identifying the needs of the reentry community within the workforce system

The members broke up into small groups with the public to address these questions:

- What is working within the workforce system for the homeless/formerly homeless Population?
- What are trends in the experiences folks in the homeless population are having as relates to access to workforce opportunities?

Each small group included one WiCAC member (one group facilitated by the HSA liaison to the Local Homeless Coordinating Board) who facilitated and recorded public response to the questions. After the small group sessions, each facilitator reported back on the comments and solutions of their break-out group.

Every participant was given colored dots to select their three top issues from any item presented by all of the break-out groups.

The community focused on these priority issues:

- A greater need for pre-release and pre-employment job readiness services
- Stronger connection/relationship between CBO's, job seekers, and employers
- Improved outreach: resource guide of available trainings, jobs programs, etc.
- Increased coordination of non-profits
- Increased coordination among city agencies, especially around funding to programs
- Increased communication among larger public aid agencies (HSA, DPH, etc.) and direct service providers—an example: shelter beds are not currently reserved for individuals in swing shift or graveyard shift employment programs

WiCAC co-facilitators will use this data to formulate committee report out at the WISF's next meeting and to work with the WISF Program Oversight Committee
