Roll Call	Kevin Carroll, WISF Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:08 A.M. He introduced and welcomed new WISF board members.
Adoption of Agenda (Action Item)	The agenda was motioned to adopt by John Doherty and seconded by Charley Lavery.
Approval of Minutes from September 14, 2016 (Action Item)	The minutes from June 8, 2016 was motioned by Andrew Lindsay and seconded by Charley Lavery.
Director's Report (Discussion Item)	Mr. Carroll invited Michael Carr, Director of Workforce to deliver the Director's Report. Workforce by the Numbers Mr. Carr shared with the Board the fiscal year 2015-2016 program outcomes for the Workforce Development of OEWD and presented on the total numbers of participants served by the Workforce Division and placed in jobs for each sector. Success Spotlight Stories To further highlight positive outcomes, Mr. Carr applauded CityBuild Employment Liaison Prentiss Jackson and his assistance to a formerly incarcerated client. Together, Prentiss and Lauren Bell from the Adult Probation Department helped the gentleman become a carpenter earning \$42/hour.

Additionally, Mr. Carr shared a video of the Success Center SF, the Western Addition Neighborhood Access Point, to highlight the collaboration and impact made in the hospitality sector.

Proposed BallotMr. Carr provided the Board with an update on the proposed ballot initiative for a Housing
and DevelopmentInitiative on Housing
and DevelopmentMr. Carr provided the Board with a copy of the
Board of Supervisors' Legislative Digest that outlined the existing law and the proposed
amendments.

Mr. Carroll introduced Ms. Amabel Akwa-Asare to speak.

Ms. Akwa-Asare informed the Board that the last strategy framework presentation was in 2012. Under WIOA, the new plan spans from March 2017 to 2021 that includes a new element—regional focus. The region that San Francisco now belongs to includes San Mateo and Santa Clara. The regional focus hopes to facilitate high response, data driven, upward mobility, service delivery that is customer centered, and more collaboration.

Key highlights of adjustments include:

- Making barrier removal and support services more of a focus
- Retention as a priority (accountable by the state for retention goals)
- Incumbent workers: increase entry level opportunities and upward mobility
- Create specific outcomes and goals for providers
- Increase intention and incentive payments for specific outcomes for providers who reach goals and above

Ms. Akwa-Asare welcomed proposals for possible new sectors that aren't currently being funded. Ms. Akwa-Asare invited Mr. Patrick Mitchel to speak on priority sector strategies for Hospitality, Health Care, Construction, and Technology.

Mr. Mitchell shared with the Board the sector strategy priorities:

- Customized training and incumbent worker training
- Contextualized work-based learning strategies
- Formally connect job seekers to academies
- Coordination with postsecondary institutions
- Retention

Mr. David Taylor informed the Board of the community services and access point strategy:

- Provide tech assistance and insight to grantees
- Receiving credit for placements through providers
- Reentry, veterans, and disability population to be highlight of RFP 121
- Possibly open new Neighborhood Access Points in the Tenderloin and Castro neighborhoods
- Discontinuation of Sector Bridge Program
