#### **Roll Call**

Kevin Carroll, interim WISF Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:09 A.M. He welcomed new member Clearnise Bullard from JobCorps Northern California Outreach and Recruitment, and introduced Pooja Deopura of Salesforce.com as the new Chair of the Youth Council.

### **Adoption of Agenda**

(Action Item)

On motion, seconded and carried, the agenda was unanimously adopted.

### **Approval of Minutes** from September 17, 2014

(Action Item)

On motion, seconded and carried, the minutes of the September 17, 2014 WISF meeting minutes were unanimously approved.

## **Director's Report**

(Discussion Item)

Mr. Carroll invited Rhonda Simmons to deliver the Director's Report.

Ms. Simmons shared recent programmatic highlights, including ongoing recruitment efforts for positions at the Market on Market and TechSF's innovative new employer engagement strategies. She invited Pat Mulligan, Director of CityBuild, to present on the Mandatory Local Hire Policy for Construction.

Mr. Mulligan shared a brief update on the Policy and the work of the Mayor's Construction Workforce Advisory Committee, which is focused on exploring ways to mitigate gaps in the construction pipeline. Discussion followed.

Ms. Simmons asked members to pause for a moment of silence in honor of former OEWD Director Jennifer Matz who passed away on December 5.

Following the moment of silence, Ms. Simmons announced her departure as Director of Workforce Development, effective early January. She thanked WISF members for their partnership and support over her 8 plus years as Director. Several members shared their gratitude for Ms. Simmons' leadership, vision and expertise.

Presentation: San Francisco Business Portal

(Discussion Item)

Kevin Carroll welcomed the next speaker, Jane Gong of the OEWD Office of Small Business, to present on the new San Francisco Business Portal website. Ms. Gong reviewed some of the key features of the site and encouraged members to utilize it and share it with their networks.

Discussion followed.

Presentation: Children and Families First Initiative

(Discussion Item)

Kevin Carroll welcomed the next speaker, Maria Su of the Department of Children, Youth and their Families. Ms. Su presented an update on the Children and Families First Initiative. She highlighted how funding would be split, how the Oversight Advisory Committee would work in conjunction with existing entities, and how services would be procured.

Discussion followed.

Presentation: San Francisco Economic Update

(Discussion Item)

Kevin Carroll welcomed the next speaker, Ted Egan of the San Francisco Office of Economic Analysis. Mr. Egan presented on local and national economic trends across the major sectors, and concerns over San Francisco's infrastructure limitations.

Discussion followed.

# Public Comment (Discussion Item)

Kevin Carroll called for public comment.

Kim Coulthurst, Pathways Consultants, shared that East Bay residents face considerable transit limitations when BART service is interrupted or slow, noting that on any given day up to 100 BART cars are in need of repair. She suggested that the WISF consider ways to partner with BART to get trains moving. Naomi Kelly responded that the Mayor has a transportation advisor that tracks BART and that the City is looking closely at lifeline utilities. Kevin Carroll added that the hospitality industry is especially impacted by this issue and that the Hotel Council is working with the Late Night Transportation Task Force to look at possible solutions.

Joe Ramirez-Forcier, Positive Resource Center, shared concerns about the way that economic data is presented, particularly that there's no way to see the impact of affordability.

Michael Blecker, Swords to Plowshares, spoke to the need to address skills gaps for veterans. Ms. Simmons shared that OEWD staff continue to work on ways to address the unique needs of veterans.
