One Stop Career Link Centers - Context

- Established under the Workforce Investment Act, 1998
- One Stop Career Link Centers are designed to provide a full range of assistance to job seekers under one roof. The centers offer training referrals, career counseling, job listings, and similar employment-related services.
- One Stop Career Link Centers also offer employers access to a prescreened and skilled pool of job candidates. As well as, obtain tax credit, bonding and other incentive hiring information.

- San Francisco implemented WIA in 2000
- Started with 3 One Stop
 - Mission Career Link Center
 - Southeast Career Link Center
 - Civic Center Career Link Center
- Provided access to resource room and job postings
- Employment fairs and tax credit information

Current One Stop Career Link System

- Expanded role of community based organizations within the One Stop Career Link Centers
- Integrated Career Advisement services into the System
- Introduced Individual Training Accounts/On the Job Training opportunities for One Stop Career Link Center customers
- Increased the number of One Stop Career Link Center Locations from 3 to 7 Centers
- Added Navigators, One Stop Complimentary Services, and ancillary services
- No longer WIA focused

 - Employment Assistance Services
- Individual and group assistance with resume and cover letter writing, and interviewing skills
- Skills assessment
- Career Planning & Exploration assistance
- Obtain information and referrals to education & training services (i.e. GED, tutoring and Vocational Training)
- Referral to One Stop Complimentary Services, Navigators or ancillary services

- One-on-One Services
- Set up blog which discusses issues impacting individuals with disabilities
- Training of One Stop Career Link Center Staff
- Maintains a Database of Disability Service Providers
 - Mental Health Services
 - Substance Abuse Services
 - Learning Disability Services
 - Physical Health Services

Child Support Services

- Job Support Program coordinated effort between the San Francisco Department of Child Support Services and One Stop Career Link System.
- Works with San Francisco Non-Custodial Parents who owe back-due child support.
- Participate in One Stop Career Link Center services/workshops in order to get a job.
- Reduces Court and Judicially based orders
