SMALL BUSINESS RELIEF PROGRAM

for businesses and employers impacted by COVID-19



Deferral of Business Taxes and Licensing Fees

Payment of first quarter 2020 businesses taxes due April 30, 2020 can be deferred until February 2021. The City is also delaying collection of annual small business license and permit fees that make up the Unified License Bill for three months.



Provide Immediate Relief

The City is establishing a fund to provide immediate relief for impacted small businesses with an initial investment of \$1 million, that will provide emergency grants of up to \$10,000 for microbusinesses that can prove recent loss in revenue.



Seek State and Federal Support

The City is seeking regulatory relief from both state and federal government around employment benefits, including unemployment, sick leave, disability, and other matters.



Private Sector and Philanthropic Support

The City is working with private sector financial partners and philanthropic organizations to identify resources, provide credit and lending flexibility, and offer direct financial support.
