


- BAVC Media provides Digital Marketing, Producer/ Editor and Editor Certificates for current TechSF participants including Apprentices.
- BAVC Media is a TechSF Hub location and can provide information about TechSF programs.
- Ages 18 and up



- Technical training and hands-on experience on video production through Academy Internships and fellowship programs.
- Interns and fellows learn project management, editing, motion graphics in Adobe Suite, and job skills.
- Workshops provide instruction in pre/postproduction, short-form video production, and career planning.
- **BAYCAT** participates in Work-Based Learning opportunities.

Ages 18-24



- Job Readiness Training program helps participants with building their resume, do mock interviews, job shadows and gain skills to reenter the workforce.
- Code Ramp students learn the basics of computer programming (HTML, CSS, and JavaScript.)
- Opportunity for All is a summer youth intern program that prepares young people for a career in Tech.

- Curriculum is comprised of 4 main competencies: Internet of Things, IT Essentials, Intro to Programming and Critical Career Skills.
- Ages 17-24
- Students receive a combination of classroom instruction, hands on training and networking opportunities.
- Provides a 12 Week Pre-Apprenticeship Occupational Skill Training Program. Graduates receive fellowship, internship and apprenticeship opportunities.



- Goodwill CJC (Comprehensive Job Center) offers training for participants interested in a career in the technology sector and the steps to enter the field.
- Ages 18 and up




- Participants engage in career exploration, learn about available education and training opportunities, career mapping/preparation and personalized one-on-one career advice to help support them to reach their next steps.
- Ages 17 and up
- JVS serves as the TechSF Coordinator, providing information about all TechSF Partner programs and hosting career exploration activities.
- Training programs available includes Salesforce Administrator (ADM-201 Certification), Google IT Support Certification, Data Analytics (partnership with Springboard) and Bookkeeping (Quickbooks Certification.)
- **Direct Placement Services provides participants** with career advising, resume and LinkedIn tips. Also included are interview practice, weekly accountability job search group, job leads and direct connections to employers.

- Mission Techies provides basic computer programming and software skills. Trainings includes front and back-end development, HTML, CSS, Terminal, JavaScript and others.
- Provides career coaching, resume writing, interview preparation and job/internship referrals.

- City College of San Francisco provides TechSF sponsored Certificate Programs in Fundamentals of Computer Technical Support and Fundamentals of Network Security. Students are prepared to take the CompTIA A+, Network+ and Security + industry standard certification exams.
